Prospects and Challenges

- Momentum for continuing policy advocacy vs. stricter controls.
- ➤ Visibility of women's rights advocacy/feminist activism with internal bio-diversity vs. social perceptions and acceptance + demonized feminism.
- Boomerang effect of international commitments (such as the FWCW & CEDAW) vs. ignorance, arrogance, and prejudice toward the international community.
- Linking with other social issues/movements vs. gender blindness and stereotype, trivialization.
